

CANDIDATES AND NOMINATORS ELIGIBILITY

Who can be nominated? (Candidates Eligibility)

A person is eligible to be nominated as a candidate in a municipal election and to hold office as a member of council if the person:

- (a) is ***at least 18 years of age*** on the day of the election;
- (b) is ***not disqualified*** pursuant to this or any other Act;
- (c) is a Canadian citizen at the time that he or she submits the nomination paper;
- (d) has ***resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months*** immediately preceding the date on which he or she submitted the nomination paper and ***has resided in that municipality***, or on land now in that municipality, ***for at least three consecutive months*** immediately preceding the date on which he or she submitted the nomination paper.

Who can nominate a candidate? (Nominators Eligibility)

A nominator must be ***eligible to vote*** in that municipality.

A person is eligible to vote in a municipality or school division who, on election day:

- (a) is a ***Canadian citizen***;
- (b) is ***at least 18 years of age***;
- (c) has ***resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months*** immediately preceding the day of the election and has ***resided in the municipality, or on land now in the municipality, for at least three consecutive months*** immediately preceding the day of the election; or (ii) is the ***owner of assessable land in the municipality***, or land now situated in the municipality, for ***at least three consecutive months*** immediately preceding the day of the election.
